In this, my third and final year as President of the Davie County United Way (DCUW) Board of Directors, I am pleased to share with you this annual report that provides an overview of all of the wonderful accomplishments that DCUW has achieved in 2008. It makes clear to me that we truly, “advance the common good of Davie County by uniting the resources of the community to identify and address the most pressing human needs.”

Thanks to the help of over 340 volunteers, providing a total of nearly 2,700 hours of volunteer service, YOUR local United Way had a very successful year in meeting the needs of our neighbors. Highlights from 2008 include:

- Call 211 Services and the local United Way office handled 354 calls for information and referral. Lamar Advertising donated 6 months additional billboard time to promote this service.
- Familywise Prescription Drug Discount Card saved Davie County families an average of 38% off the cost of their prescriptions.
- United Way invested nearly \$291,000 into 25 programs that provide services for our neighbors.
- Home Loss Prevention kept 30 families from foreclosure or eviction with nearly 50% of those families showing their gratitude by giving back to our community through volunteerism.
- Over 300 lives were touched during Day of Caring as hundreds of volunteers completed 60 projects with an additional 17 projects completed as part of the Day of Caring spin-off: the Housing Repair Assistance Coalition.

We thank everyone who has reached out a hand to one and influenced the condition of all. Each of you have helped Davie County United Way to advance the common good of our area.

Day of Caring

For our second springtime Day of Caring, DCUW had a record number of request for assistance with 65 projects submitted. One hundred ninety-three volunteers helped to complete sixty of these projects and over 300 lives were touched as part of Day of Caring 2008. But the need did not cease. To respond, DCUW joined with The Advocacy Center and the Department of Social Services to create the Housing Repair Assistance Coalition. The goal of this Coalition is to address Day of Caring type projects on a year-round basis. In 2008, an additional 17 projects were completed for people in need through the Housing Repair Assistance Coalition.

Home Loss Prevention (HeLP)

HeLP began in 2003 as mortgage assistance and has grown to provide mortgage or rent relief during times of temporary need due to emergency situations such as medical problems, recent unemployment, or natural disaster. This program is designed to encourage and facilitate recipients to return to self-sufficiency by providing a financial literacy component and promotes volunteerism within Davie County by requiring recipients give back to our community through 12 hours of volunteer service. In 2008, over 30 families were saved from losing their homes through this program. 100% of those families were provided budgeting education and 48% completed volunteer service for nonprofits in Davie County.

United Way Call 211 Services

Call 211 is an information and referral service that is free, confidential and available 24 hours a day, seven days a week. The three digit access number gives callers quick linkage to get help or give help in the same way that 411 and 911 are universally recognized. Last year more than 354 connections were made between people of Davie County and services or programs by calling the Davie County United Way office or Call 2-1-1 Services.

Prescription Drug Discount Card Program

The Familywise Prescription Discount Card program helps to bridge the gap for the uninsured or underinsured of Davie County. Distribution partners in 2008 to include the Department of Social Services, A Storehouse for Jesus, Cancer Services, Senior Services, DCUW and all participating pharmacies. The program's total average percent of savings for Davie County residents increased from 21% in 2007 to 38% in 2008.

Community Initiatives and Outreach

Analysis of the 2007 Needs Assessment led the DCUW Board of Directors to choose four community initiatives upon which to work in addition to our community impact areas: Minority Teen Pregnancy, Affordable & Accessible Childcare, Suicide Prevention and Intervention, and Transportation.

DCUW has begun this work with the Suicide Prevention/Intervention area by joining the Suicide Prevention Task Force in Davie County. This group is working to identify persons at-risk and reach out with a helping hand. DCUW has also begun work on Affordable & Accessible Childcare by serving on the Childcare Subsidy Task Force, which addresses the need for child care subsidy in Davie County. This work has resulted in the elimination waiting list exists for child care subsidy in Davie County.

Emergency Food & Shelter Program:

In 2008, DCUW secured \$9,883.00 of the state set-aside funds available from the Emergency Food and Shelter National Board. The award was based on a formula that was based on the combined number of persons in poverty plus the combined number of persons unemployed from all applying counties who did not receive an automatic distribution of funds.

In May, a local board representing American Red Cross, Catholic Charities, United Jewish Communities, the National Council of Churches, The Salvation Army, United Way and the community at large reviewed applications for Davie County's local designation and distributed the funds to following local agencies:

A Storehouse for Jesus\$4,942.00
The Salvation Army\$4,941.00

Cooleemee Kids Initiative:

Davie County United Way was instrumental in the creation and launch of the Cooleemee Kids Initiative. To convene this group, DCUW worked with other interested parties in Cooleemee to hold a community forum with the intent of developing a complete initiative with the following components:

Recognized Need: Modern life is taking its toll on families and the traditional social fabric of our community. Family time is too short; community youth activities are not adequate.

Mission: To enrich the lives of local young people by fostering their healthy passage to adulthood.
Goals:

1. To engage and focus the knowledge, energy and resources of Cooleemee's citizens and neighbors, churches, civic groups, scouts, fire department, school and library to develop and sustain recreational and other enrichment activities that foster our young people.
2. To create and sustain programs that shelter young people in the arms of a loving community, that promote self-discipline as well as instill good character, the worth of productive labor, service to others, intellectual curiosity and respect for elders.
3. To conduct activities that develop healthy bodies and minds as well as make growing up in Cooleemee a fun and memorable experience.

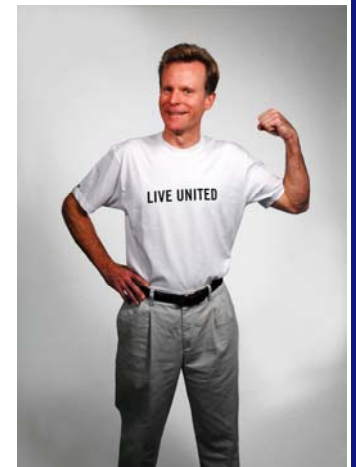
